"I can not hug a fish," Pam said.

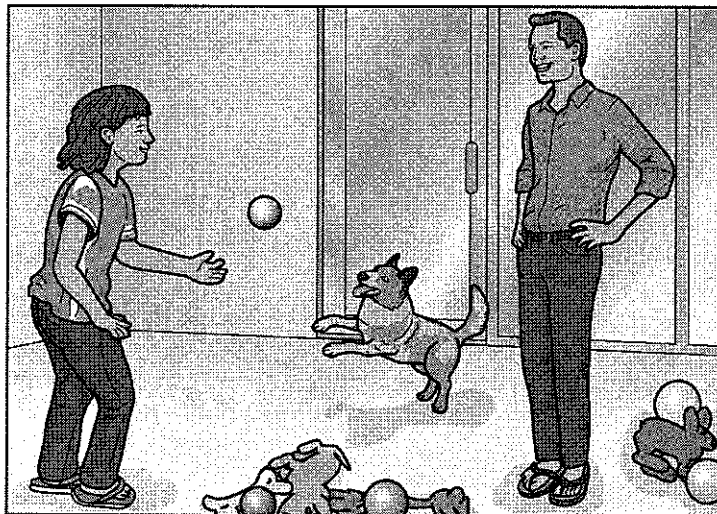
Dad said, "We can go to the animal shelter."

Add water if the dirt is not wet.

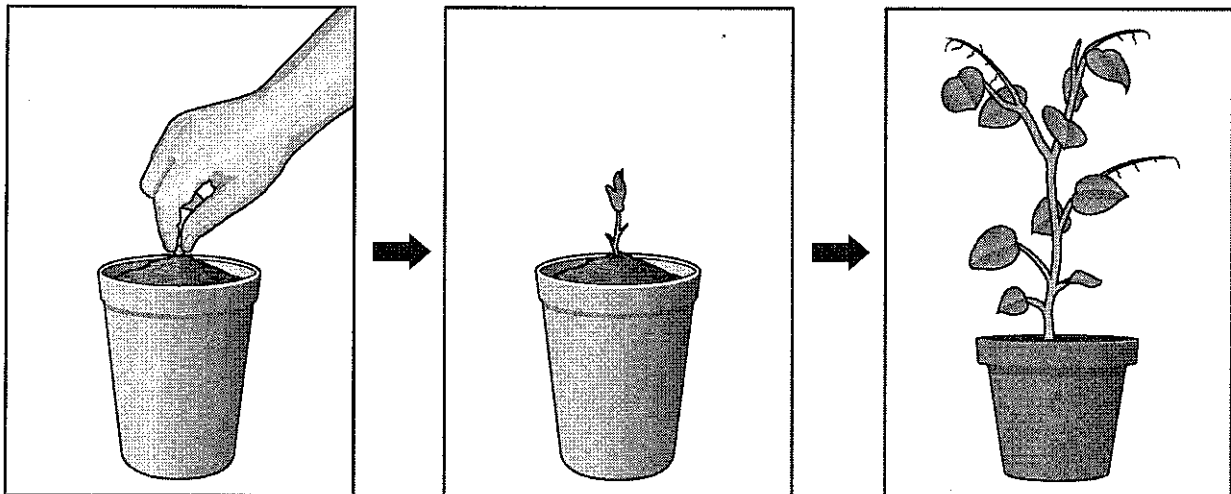
The pea plant will pop up one day.
