

An IEP, or Individualized Education Program, lays out a student's entire program mandate, including their class program and related services as well as goals and management needs.

An IESP, or Individualized Education Services Program, does not include a class program mandate as, in asking the District to develop an IESP or allowing them to do so, **parents are agreeing to pay for their child's tuition**.

There is no point more important to understand about the differences between these two documents than that.
